
All good things must come to an end



NETHERLANDS PHILATELISTS OF CALIFORNIA 1969-2019

In December 1969, a group of stamp collectors met at the home of Ralph Van Heerden in Saratoga, California. Besides Ralph, present were Claus Goetzl, John Heimans, Harold MacDonald, Frank Ruys, Bert Schapelhouman, and George Vandenberg. Their common interest was ‘Netherlands and related areas’ stamps.

They called themselves the “Dutch Stamp Collectors“ (Fig. 1)

Since the inception of the club, meetings were held on a monthly basis. In the early days meetings were held at the Sunnyvale Library and in the hospitality room of two local banks. Later on meetings have been held on a rotating basis on the third Saturday of the month, twelve times a year, at a member's home. The in-home meetings proved to be more satisfactory with their informal atmosphere. Gradually, with a decreasing number of ‘local’ members, meetings were held every other month, and lately every three months.

Sometime during 1970 they changed the name to the Netherlands & Colonies Philatelists of Northern California, considering themselves to be the California chapter of Netherlands & Colonial Philately, which was based in New York. The “Netherlands and Colonial Philately” of January 1971 had a short note: “California has done it! Mr. Schapelhouman, 651 Distel Drive, Los Altos, Cal. 94022 has written me that a Northern Chapter of N.C.P has definitely been formed with a promising number of members. Exact details are lacking at the moment, but we

are sure that, with such men as Mr. van Heerden, Dr. Ruys, Mr. Schapelhouman and others "Netherlands and Colonies Philatelists" Chapter will thrive and grow to a substantial organization."




Fig. 3 "The 1872 issue", published in 1974.

In 1974 the members had been active for five years, and on this occasion, the first 'anniversary publication' was published. It was "The 1872 Issue", with 31 pages of detailed information gathered by eight members. (Fig. 3)





Fig. 4 10th NPOfC Anniversary luncheon in 1979

In 1979 the 10th Anniversary was celebrated not only with a 34 page "10 Year Anniversary Commemorative Booklet", with contributions from ten members, but also with a luncheon at a Mountain View, CA restaurant. (Fig.4)

From then on social meetings, where partners are invited, have been held twice a year, once in the summer and the second one during the Christmas/New Year period.

In March 1987 it was decided to no longer use the word "Colonies" in the name of the organization but from there on to call it "Netherlands Philatelists of California", 'NPofC' for short. (Fig. 5)




Fig. 6 One of the more elaborate entries into the Cancel of the Month

In 1995, when about ten 'local' members regularly attended the monthly meetings a new feature called "Cancel of the Month" was introduced. The rules were: "All club members in good standing and present at the monthly meeting can submit his or her entry for the cancellation of the month. This cancellation must be on a single stamp which can be on or off cover. On submitting the entry the member must also submit a copy of the stamp on a 8 ½ x 11 sheet with a short statement about the stamp, such as date of issue, type date, and origin of the cancelation etc.". The attending members, by majority vote, picked the best cancelation. (Fig. 6)

During the Christmas/New Year get-together the Cancel of Year was picked.




Fig. 7 Cover of the Month, May 1998




Fig. 8 Open Category of the Month, 2002

This feature was such a success that over time two new categories were added: "Cover of the Month" (Fig. 7) and "Open Category of the Month" (Fig. 8).

NPofC members have entered their framed exhibits (for example Dennis Buss’ exhibit on the [1940 Guilloche issue](#)) in local and national stamps shows and won awards for their presentations. Several members have served and are serving as officers of the American Society for Netherlands Philately (ASNP) and other philatelic organizations.




Fig. 9 Invitation to the 2003 Holiday Dinner. Notice the “Pacifica 1/1” half-round cancellation.

Every year we have had a Potluck Luncheon at a member’s home and a Holiday Dinner (Fig. 9) at a local restaurant where members were encouraged to bring their partners. During the Holiday Dinner the best Cover of the Year, Cancel of the Year and Open Category of the Year were voted on.
